Dear Parents and Carers,

The Stephanie Alexander Cooking/Gardening program is one of our most loved programs at the school. Michele has asked for volunteers a number of times through the newsletter, disappointingly we have had not had any parent response to her request. To volunteer, your child does not have to be in Year 3-6. Due to an increase in student numbers, we desperately need more volunteers to help out with both gardening and cooking. **Without volunteers to help, the program is at risk of not continuing.** Volunteers could opt to come once a term, monthly, weekly or fortnightly. Year 3-5 garden and cooking is on a Wednesday and Year 4-6 on a Thursday. The commitment you would be making is for three hours, one hour for gardening between 10.00am and 11.00am and two hours for cooking between 11.30 and 1.30. Your lunch for the day is provided when you sit and eat with the students after your preparation. Listening to our Year 6 students last year at Graduation reminded us how much the students enjoy this opportunity each week and value the skills they gain. **For this great program to continue we need your support, without your support it will not be able to operate. Please contact the office to let us know when you can be involved and Michele will draw up a roster. Thank you for your anticipated support.** (Form in this newsletter)

At times parents will pick up other students at the end of the day. It is a requirement that we know who is picking up your child if you are unable to do so. Please call the office or send a note to explain if there is a change in who is collecting your child. As you can appreciate, there are often a range of custody orders in place and we need to be able to demonstrate permission for children to travel with others.

**If you are picking up your child early, can you please come to the office to sign out and wait for your child to come and meet you.** The office will call your child to come over with their bag. This process is to avoid interruption to the classroom program and to limit people in the school grounds during class time ensuring the safety of our students. Your support with this is expected and appreciated.

In a bid to cut down on our paper usage and reduce our carbon footprint, we are interested in finding out how many families would prefer to receive our newsletter via email. We realise there will be some families who will not want to go paperless due to unreliable internet but we welcome those who are willing to make the swap. Don't forget the newsletter is also regularly loaded onto our school website. We are currently working on updating the website to reflect our current operations. Daily attendance at school is critical for your child's education. If a child misses 10 minutes a day, that equals 50 minutes a week which is nearly 1.5 weeks a year and over 13 years of schooling that's nearly half a year..... If your child is away or you are running late can you please contact the office to advise them of the absence. The Department of Education and Training tracks all absences and we need to be able to explain why a student was absent. ## HEAD LICE



Headlice continues to pose a huge problem for just a few of our families, just enough to keep Head Lice as a continuing problem at school and home.

All parents need to check their children's hair on a daily basis and ensure that if there are any signs of either live headlice or eggs that the proper treatment occurs before the student returns to school.

# PARENT AND CARERS WALKING GROUP

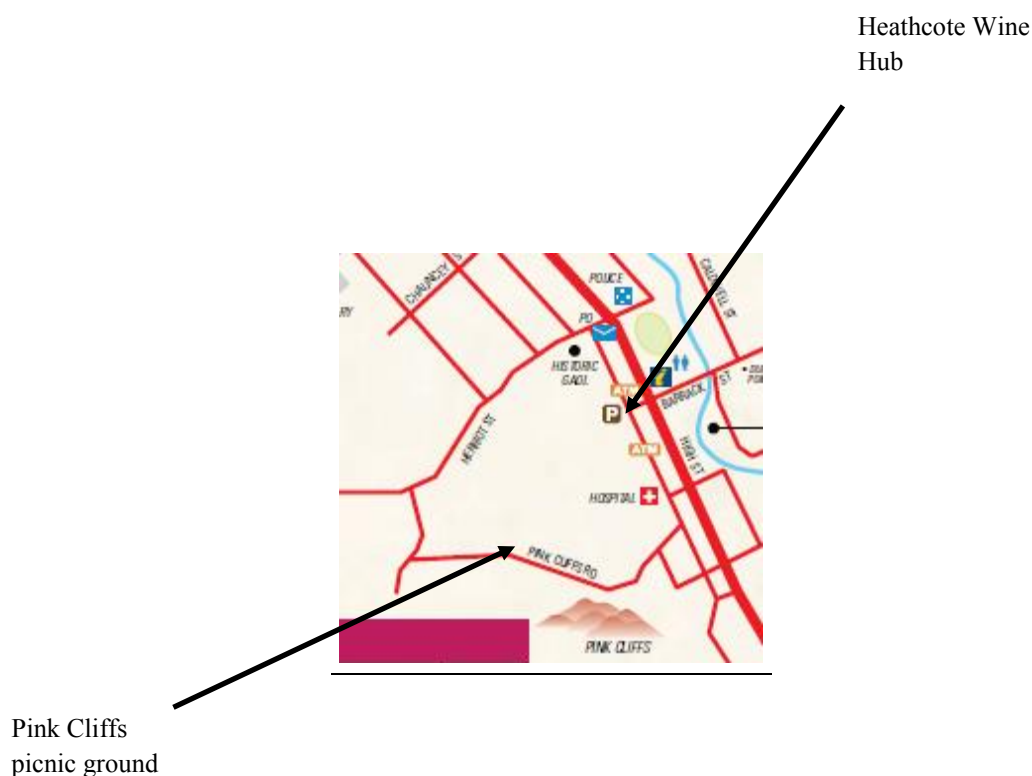
## PINK CLIFFS AND COFFEE

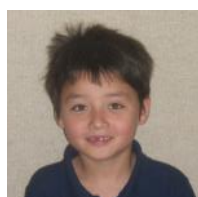
If you are walking please try to remember a water bottle, hat and sunscreen. I have provided a map below to assist with directions.
