STEM

We have commenced work on chemical changes. The senior students performed two experiments to demonstrate the difference between physical changes of state and chemical changes. The physical change occurred when sugar dissolved in vinegar. The chemical change occurred when sodium bicarbonate was added to vinegar. Very similar looking experiments but with different results!

The junior students created a “rainbow wizard’s brew”. Jars of different coloured “brew” bubbled up and over the lip of jars, mixing together to make a rainbow of colours in the bottom of a tub.
